Sunshine

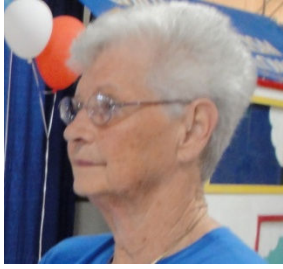
1. To send cards when notified of someone's need for cheering up, or a word of sympathy or comfort.

Ways & Means

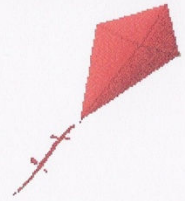
1. To come up with fundraising ideas and see that they are implemented because without money the club cannot function

Say Thanks to Our Troops

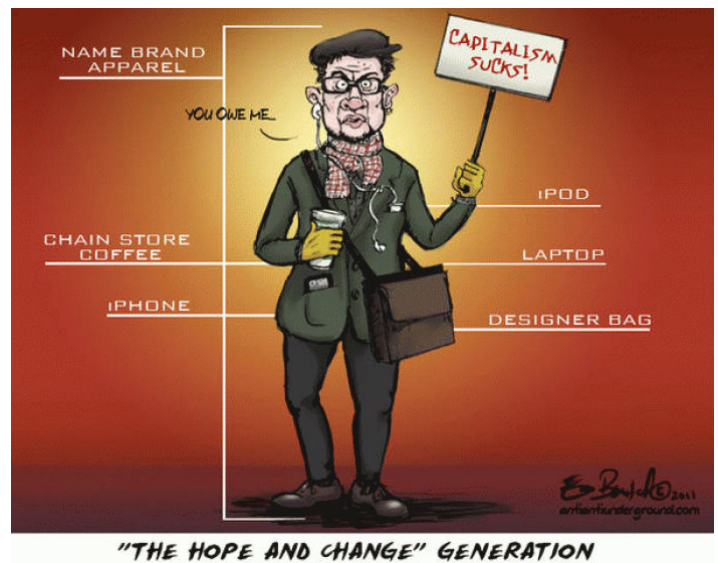
