The girls went to other stores with similar results. Veteran's Day found them back at Major Market where they collected \$425.00. With the help of their two cousins, they sent off many boxes to Iraq and Afghanistan. The grateful soldiers responded with letters and Christmas cards. Recently Jamie decided to move the whole process to her school. She is a senior at Mission Hills High School. Her criminal justice teacher happens to be very enthusiastic about helping the troops, so much so that he has been contributing \$100.00 each month. Jamie shared with him that she had received a request from a soldier in Afghanistan for letters. He immediately issued an assignment to the class to write letters. She received 40 letters that were "chatty" and full of information and encouragement. Jamie and her club just gained permission to put a table in the quad area at school to ask for Valentine cards for the men and women in Afghanistan. The first day they received cards from their friends. Then other students joined in. Last count 50 cards to be included with the boxes to be sent off soon.

CFRW Winter Conference - February 6 and 7 - Westlake Village

Theme: WIN: Women in Numbers

First thing was a new website update and unveiling given by Allison Olson, our advocate in Sacramento.

The conference was then called to order at 12:00 noon. After lunch, the first speaker was Jean Fuller, assemblywoman for the 32nd Assembly District speaking on "Securing California's Water Future": Two workshops were held: Membership Promotion and Public Relations and Marketing for the 21st Century. Then a US Navy veteran introduced us to an organization called Stars and Stripes. This group wants to bring the United States back to the basic principles upon which our country was founded.

At the banquet that evening, we heard from Carly Fiorina, who is running for Barbara Boxer's seat in the US Senate. She was introduced by Alice Starr who is married to Kenneth Starr, also in attendance. Our next speaker was Mimi Walter, a state senator running for California Treasurer.

Sunday morning, more speakers: Chuck Devore, assemblyman running for Barbara Boxer's seat; Damon Dunn running for Secretary of State (CA); Lydia Gutierrez running for CA state superintendent of public schools; Tom Harman, state senator running for CA attorney general.
