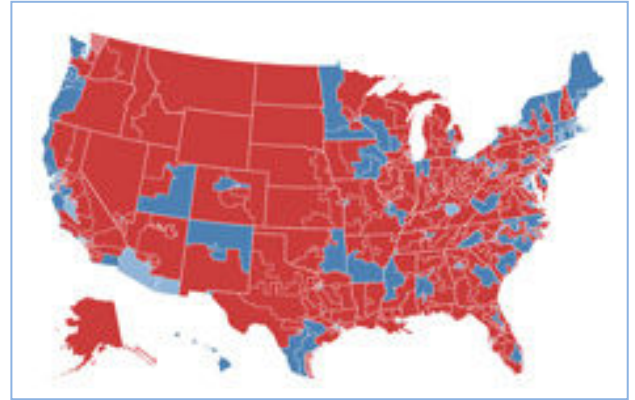
November 2010 has come and gone and Republicans did well with much to be proud of.
