All The King's Men...And Women

It must have been by a perceived divine right that Obama named Steve Rattner to be car czar to oversee the government takeover of Chrysler and General Motors; there is certainly no authority in the Constitution for the President to take such action. Rattner, with the blessing of king Obama, set out to punish his king's opponents and reward his king's supporters.

Of the 789 Chrysler dealers closed by Rattner, [788 had contributed exclusively to Republican candidates](#). Moreover, not one of a string of Chrysler dealerships owned by Obama supporters, Robert Johnson and Mack McClarty, was closed, but virtually all of the dealerships that competed with the Johnson-McClarty chain were closed. Chrysler president Jim Press said: "[It really wasn't Chrysler's decision](#)." Rattner resigned July 13 in the face of a multi-million dollar pay-for-play scandal in New York.

Another of the king's men, Van Jones, bit the dust when the public learned that he was a self-proclaimed communist who signed a petition calling for the investigation of the Bush administration for complicity in the 9-11 tragedy. These views were perfectly all right with the king, whose chief advisor Valerie Jarrett, said "...we've been watching him as long as he's been active..." Jones' radical ideas were fine with the king, until the public expressed its dissatisfaction.

Speaking of Valerie Jarrett, the king's closest advisor, her Chicago exploits cannot go unrewarded. She

was in charge of [two housing projects that were among the world's worst](#). While the king was only a prince in the Illinois legislature, he consistently voted to up the funding for housing projects such as those Valerie managed. Now that Valerie is the king's salesman to the Olympic Committee, pitching Chicago for the site of the 2016 Olympics, guess who would benefit most by her success: the developers who own the land under and around Jarrett's failed housing projects -- where the proposed Olympic stadium is to be constructed..

It is not at all surprising that another bird in the flock wants to repeal the First Amendment. Mark Lloyd, who holds the title of Chief Diversity Officer at the Federal Communications Commission, *is now in a position to render obsolete the whole idea of free speech*. The Constitution forbids Congress from making any law that infringes on the right to free speech; the Constitution does not know about the FCC or its Chief Diversity Officer, however. He is a big fan of Hugo Chavez, and *celebrates his takeover of the media as the primary reason for his success*.

Lloyd is too smart to tackle the First Amendment head-on. Instead, he contends that there is a structural imbalance in media ownership that allows the likes of Rush Limbaugh and other conservative radio hosts to have far more impact than minority voices. His cure for this situation is to levy a tax up to 100 percent of a station's operating budget to be redistributed to minority-owned stations and to NPR. Much of Lloyd's writing seems to suggest that he favors converting NPR to the official government media, and doing away with private media altogether.

It is every person's responsibility to share this information so that all are aware of the harm the current administration has done and will continue to do if allowed to continue. I encourage every member of the EBRWF to volunteer to register voters, and/or serve on a local Republican campaign. We must support all Republican candidates in every possible way.

The National Federation of Republican Women's 35th Biennial Convention in Orlando Florida was attended by Marta Zanghi and Jacqueline Crumpley, as well as approximately 1200 other representatives.

The speakers included the Governor of Florida, Charlie Crist; the Governor of Minnesota, Tim Pawlenty; both of whom gave inspiring speeches. Also, the Chairman of the Republican National Committee, Michael Steele encouraged us to groom Republican women candidates.

The following amendments were addressed:

The motion to raise dues by two dollars was approved by a 490 to 179 vote.

The proposed amendment for Article 3 Section 3 Requirements B regarding non-Republican speakers in local clubs was discussed enthusiastically on the floor. Some argued that this would prohibit them from having forums with all candidates. It was decided that this amendment should be postponed indefinitely.

The proposed amendment for Article 3 Section 3 Requirement B was passed requiring each state federation to hold a minimum of two boards of director meetings per year.

The proposed amendment for Article 3 Section 6 was passed allowing a local club to be removed from membership by a 2/3 vote of the NFRW Executive Committee.

The proposed amendment for Article 8 Section 5 Fiscal Year B was passed so college clubs will have a fiscal year of August 1 to July 31 to coincide with their school terms.

All in all a great time was had, great people met, and great food eaten!

"Decline to State" Voters From Wikipedia, the free encyclopedia

Decline to State (DTS) is an affiliation designation on the California voter registration form that allows voters to register to vote without choosing a party affiliation. It is similar to what in other states would be called declaring oneself as an *independent*. Although the term *independent* is often used to designate DTS voters, that term invites confusion with the American Independent Party.

In February 1999, 12.89% of registered voters in California declined to state a party affiliation. That figure had risen to 18.18% by January 2006, and to 19.91% by October 15, 2008. The growth of the category Decline to State follows California's switch from the closed primary to an open primary system in 1996 following the adoption of Proposition 198. Until 1996, only voters who were registered with a political party could vote in that party's primary election. In the June 1998 and March 2000 primary elections, voters could vote for any candidate in any party's primary.

On June 26, 2000, the United States Supreme Court decided in *California Democratic Party, et al. v. Jones* 530 U.S. 567 (2000) [1] that California's open primary system violated the right of free association. In January 2001, following the passage of SB28 (Ch. 898, Stats. 2000), a new modified closed system took effect in which voters registered with a particular party can only vote in that party's primary, but voters who decline to state a party affiliation can vote in one party's primary if the party agrees to allow it (California Elections Code §2151).

The Democratic and Republican parties have allowed voters who decline to state a party affiliation to vote in all of their respective primary elections until the 2008 presidential primary election, when DTS could vote in the Democratic Party primary if they asked for a Democratic ballot while they could not opt for a Republican ballot.

Democrats have proposed the establishment of a public-option government-run health plan. Some of the consequences of this government take over of health care include higher costs, lower quality and fewer choices.

Government Control: Government programs constitute nearly half of all health care spending, and further increasing government's clout may well limit patient care as a way to contain costs. The federal government already imposes price controls on doctors, hospitals and pharmaceutical companies. Controls on patient procedures are likely to follow.

Spending and Tax Increases: Democrats proposed more than \$850 billion in tax increases on small businesses and middle class families to pay for their health care reform plan. Health spending will jump from 16.6% to 17.6% of GDP this year alone. House Democrats are calling for an additional \$1.6 trillion in new health spending - on top of the more than \$150 billion in health spending in the "stimulus" bill.

Massive, Forced Dislocation of Currently Insured Individuals: Analysis by actuaries at the independent Lewin Group found that nearly 114 million individuals could involuntarily lose their private coverage due to a government-run plan, and be forced into the public plan.

Reduced Revenue for Providers: Other analysis by the Lewin Group found that a government-run plan reimbursing at Medicare rates would cause hospitals' total revenue to drop by nearly 5% (\$36.5 billion), and physicians' total revenue to decline by nearly 7% (\$36.4 billion).

Poorer Coverage and Access: CBO Director Doug Elmendorf recently testified that traditional Medicare provides a benefit package 15% lower than the standard employer-sponsored plan which is one reason why more than four in five Medicare beneficiaries rely on supplemental health coverage. In Medicaid, low provider

participation rates often lead to long waits for care, such that low-income Americans would prefer private insurance coverage to Medicaid by a more than two-to-one margin.

Fraud: Reports by the Government Accountability Office and other watchdog groups have highlighted persistent problems with fraud in government-run Medicare - estimating tens of billions per year, at taxpayer expense.
